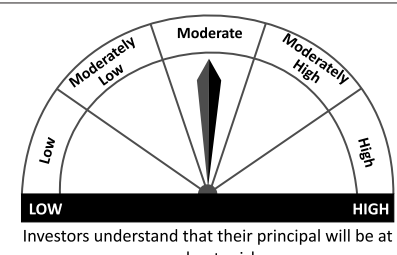

Notice for ICICI Prudential Fixed Maturity Plan - Series 75 - 1100 Days Plan T (the Scheme)

This Product is suitable for investors who are seeking*:

- Short Term savings solution
- A Debt Fund that seeks to generate income by investing in a portfolio of fixed income securities/debt instruments maturing on or before the maturity of the Scheme.

NOTICE-CUM-ADDENDUM is hereby given to all the investors of the Scheme, in terms of enabling provisions of Regulation 33(4) of SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996, for rolling over (extension of maturity date) of the Scheme. Pursuant to provision to Regulation 33(4) of SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996, it is proposed to roll over (extend the maturity date) the Scheme to May 31, 2018. The existing maturity date is November 23, 2017. The details and material terms of such roll over (extension of maturity date) are as follows:

- 1. Purpose:** The purpose of the roll over (extension of maturity date) is to continue to benefit from the prevailing yields in the fixed income market taking into consideration the current economic and regulatory environment.
- 2. Period:** 189 days. Accordingly, the revised maturity date of the Scheme will be May 31, 2018.
- 3. Extended Maturity Date:** May 31, 2018 (or immediately following business day if the maturity date falls on a non-business day.)
- 4. Date of Roll over:** November 24, 2017 (or immediately following business day if the maturity date falls on a non-business day.)
- 5. Terms of roll over (extension of maturity date):** Upon roll over of the Scheme, certain provisions of the Scheme stand modified. The existing and modified provisions are stated below:

Please note that pursuant to SEBI circular No. Cir/IMD/DF/15/2014 dated June 20, 2014 read with Regulation 39(2)(c) of SEBI (Mutual Funds) Regulations, 1996 the Scheme would be wound up, after repaying the amount due to the unitholders in case any of the below mentioned conditions are not fulfilled during the roll over process:

1. the Scheme shall have a minimum of 20 investors
 2. the assets under management (AUM) of the Scheme is atleast ₹ 20 crore
- Further, the investors are also requested to note that in case single investor accounts for more than 25% of the corpus of the Scheme post the roll-over, the roll-over application would be effective only to the extent of 25% of the corpus of the Scheme. The extent of exposure in excess of the stipulated 25% limit would be liable to be rejected and consequently such exposure over 25% limit will be refunded.

All the other provisions of the Scheme Information Document (SID)/Key Information Memorandum (KIM)/addenda except as specifically modified herein above remain unchanged. Please refer to the Statement of Additional Information, for updated taxation provision. For more information, you may also consult your tax or financial advisor.

The approval slip can be submitted either at the nearest branch of ICICI Prudential Asset Management Company Ltd. or at any of the service locations of Computer Age Management Services Private Limited. Alternatively, you may also provide your consent to roll over by writing to us at txn@icicipruamc.com through your email id registered with us. In case you do not consent to the said changes, your investment under the Scheme shall be redeemed at applicable NAV on the existing maturity date. If the units are held in dematerialized form, investors are requested to contact their Depository Participant.

The cut-off time to submit the approval slip or send the consent mail for the rollover is 6 p.m. on the maturity date. Any request received after 6 p.m. will not be processed. Please note that the approval slip or the mail should have Investor's name, folio number and the Scheme name, failing which the roll over request may not be accepted.

In view of the individual nature of the implications, each Unit holder is advised to consult his or her own tax advisors/financial advisors with respect to the specific amount of tax and other implications arising out of his or her participation in the Resetting the maturity of the Scheme.

The Trustee/AMC reserves the right to change/modify the provisions mentioned above at a later date.

This Notice-cum-Addendum forms an integral part of the SID/KIM/addenda of the Scheme of ICICI Prudential Mutual Fund, as amended from time to time.
